1. COURSE OUTLINE

The Summer School Global Challenges focuses on the political, economic and security issues that shape and reconfigure the architecture of the international system. Its major goal consists on the analysis and understanding of the political and strategic framework that shape geopolitics, geoeconomy and international development, as well as the strategy of major global players. It is offered as a Specialised Seminar by IPPS-IUL and is also an ECTS multidisciplinary course of the Master in International Studies of ISCTE-IUL. This Summer School is a scientific product of the Centre for International Studies (CEI-IUL) and the Institute Marquês de Valle Flor (IMVF) and has the collaboration of the Lisbon Club.

FERNANDO JORGE CARDOSO



Invited Associate Professor at ISCTE-IUL, Head of Strategic and Development Studies of the Institute Marquês de Valle Flôr and Executive Director of the Lisbon Club. He received his PhD (1991) and Habilitations (2006) from ISEG-UL. In Mozambique he was Dean of the School of Economics of the Eduardo Mondlane University (1978-1983), Advisor to the Minister of Planning (1977-1983) and CEO of Maragra, a sugar company (1983-1985). In Portugal he conducted since 1991 research, education and management activities in several university institutions. He was head of the Africa Programme of the Institute for Strategic and International Studies (1991-2012). He was consultant on the elaboration/evaluation of aid programmes in Angola, Mozambique and Cape Verde. He was copresident of the Organising Committee of Estoril Conferences (2009; 2011). He has an extensive list of publications on African, Development and International Relations.

ANA PAULA FERNANDES



Chief of the Unit of Prospective, Reform and Global Relations at OECD. She was Adviser to the OECD Director of the Development Direction (2016), Technical Adviser at the Portuguese Permanent Delegation to the OECD (2009-2015), Deputy-Chair of DAC (4 years), facilitator to the Statistics Group of DAC, Co-chair of the Working Group Investment and Development of OECD – AGID and presided to the reform of the OECD Development Centre. Previously she was Adviser to the Portuguese Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and Cooperation (2005-2009), Responsible for Development Cooperation projects at the Institute Marquês de Valle Flor (1999-2005), Researcher at the Institute for Strategic and International Studies, (1997-1999), Advisor to the Board of QBO Trading (1996-1997) and Volunteer of the NGO “Leigos para o Desenvolvimento” in Mozambique (1994-1995). Until 2009 she also collaborated with some Universities as Invited Lecturer. She got a BA in International Relations from the University of Minho (1994) and a MA in International Cooperation from ISCTE – IUL (2001).

ANA RITA SEQUEIRA



Lecturer and Researcher at the Health Administration, Policy and Leadership Program of the School of Business and Governance at Murdoch University (Western Australia). She graduated from ISCTE-IUL and was Associate Researcher at CEI-IUL. Her research interests cohering global health and public health; health policy and economics; critical and interpretative approaches; development studies and how to translate research into practice, bringing together both community and consumer perspectives. Besides her post- and undergraduate teaching, she is the digital learning lead educator in a program of the Future Learn on Health Policy and Governance. Her professional experience also encompassed program management in humanitarian organisations in Mozambique, and applied research to inform public policy in Australia, Mozambique, South Africa, Zambia, and East-Timor.

ANTÓNIO COSTA SILVA



CEO of Partex Oil & Gas and Professor at IST, University of Lisbon. He got a BA in Mining Engineering from IST-UL, a MA in Oil Engineering from the Imperial College and a PhD from the Imperial College and from the IST-UL. He initiated his professional carrier at Sonangol in Angola in 1980. He worked at the Companhia Portuguesa de Serviços (1984-1997) and was executive director of the French multinational Compagnie Générale de Geophysique (1998-2001). He was appointed in 2002 by the International Court of the Chamber of Commerce of Stockholm as international expert to solve the dispute between 2 major oil companies at a Sea of China field. From 2001 to 2003 he worked at the French Oil Institute in Paris, on its corporation branch, as Director of Reservoir Engineering and Director of Operations.

BRUNO CARDOSO REIS



Assistant Professor at ISCTE-IUL and associate Researcher at the King's College. He got a BA in History from the University of Lisbon, a MA in Historical Studies from the University of Cambridge and a PhD in War Studies from the King's College. He also lectures at the Nova Lisbon University and collaborates with the CEHR of the Catholic University. He belongs to the International Studies Association, the British International Studies Association and the London Institute for International and Strategic Studies. He published extensively on history and international relations; his work *Salazar e o Vaticano* (Lisbon: ICS, 2007) received the Book Prizes Vítor de Sá and Aristides de Sousa Mendes. His current fields of interest include history and

theory of international relations, colonialism and decolonization, strategy and non-conventional conflicts, foreign and defence policy, religions and international security.

CARLOS BRANCO



Major General of the Portuguese Army (reserve). He holds a MA on Military Sciences (Military Academy, Lisbon). He was in the Balkans, before Dayton, as UN military observer. He served in EUROFOR HQ, Florence, as Chief of the Intelligence Analysis Section. In 2001, he was assigned to the Military Division of the DPKO, UN Head Quarters, as Peacekeeping Affairs Officer for the UN missions in the Middle East. He was Battalion, Regiment Commander and Airborne Brigade Deputy Commander and COMISAF spokesperson in Afghanistan. In 2008, he was Deputy

Director of the National Defence Institute and Army Director of Doctrine before being Director of Cooperation & Regional Security in the International Military Staff, NATO HQ. He was Deputy Director, at the War College. He has more than 55 articles on technical-military, conflict resolution, security, defense matters in books, periodicals, daily news and co-edited 2 books on peacekeeping.

CATARINA ROSETA PALMA



Assistant Professor at ISCTE-IUL. Her main research interests are in environmental and natural resource economics, especially in the areas of water management, behavioral models, uncertainty, and growth. She has several publications in these areas. She has taught Environmental Economics, Public Economics, and Microeconomics at the undergraduate as well as graduate level, and she has coordinated a graduate degree in Corporate Sustainability. She's the vice-president of the European Association of Environmental and Resource Economists. She worked with INAG (Portuguese Water Authority) on the implementation of the economic aspects of the Water Framework Directive in Portugal. She has also worked as a

consultant for the Portuguese Environment Ministry, the European Commission and the River Basin Authorities of Alentejo and Algarve.

CLARA CARVALHO



Assistant Professor at ISCTE-IUL. Since July 2015 she is President of AEGIS. Until May 2016 she was the first Chair of the Center of International Studies (CEI-IUL). She is also Vice-President of the General Assembly of the Lisbon Club. She was Invited Professor at Université de Lille (2002-2003) and Brown University (2004) and at the Methodological Ateliers of CODESRIA (2005, 2007, 2008). She published a number of works, among them “Reflexions sur les histoires d’origine à Pecixe (Cacheu, Guinée-Bissau)” in *Migrations Anciennes sur les Hautes Côtes de Guinée*, Gérald Gaillard & Marie-Paule Ferry ed., Paris, L’Harmattan, 2000; “A Persistência da História” (with João de Pina Cabral, ed.), Lisboa, ICS, 2005; “Guinean Migrant Traditional Healers in the Global Market” in *Medicine, Mobility and Power in Global Africa. Transnational Health and Healing*, ed. Hansjörg Dilger, Abdoulaye Kane & Stacey Langwick, Indiana UP 2013. She holds a PhD in Anthropology from ISCTE-IUL.

FRANCISCO SEIXAS DA COSTA



Independent non-executive Member of the Board of Jerónimo Martins SGPS, of Mota Engil SGPS and of EDP Renewables SA. He is international consultant of the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation. He is also Member of the Board of the Lisbon Club. He was former Portuguese Ambassador at UN, OSCE, UNESCO, Brazil and France. He was Secretary of State for European Affairs (1995-2001) and Executive Director of the North-South Centre (2013-2014). Since 2013 he is Member of the Consultative Council of the School of Economic (University of Coimbra). He lectures at University Autónoma of Lisbon and belongs to the Scientific Council of *Política Internacional* and of *Janus - Journal of International Relations*. He authored several books and articles on international relations and security and he is columnist in two daily newspapers. He got a BA on Political and Social Sciences from the Technical University of Lisbon.

ISABEL FERREIRA NUNES



Head of the Research Center at the National Defense Institute (IDN), directs the National Defense Course and represents IDN at the Executive Academic Committee of the European College of Security and Defense. She was Deputy Director of IDN (2006-2008). Holds a PhD in Political Science from the University of Twente and a postdoc in International Relations from the University of Groningen. She was a Fellow Researcher of the Foundation for Science and Technology (2002-05; 2009-10) and got a scholarship for a NATO Scientific Research Program (1999-2001). Was advisor at Secretary of Defense International Relations Cabinet (1987-1990) and at International Relations Department of General Defense Policy (1990-1995). She is external reviewer for 'Journal of Common Market Studies' and 'International Relations'. Her latest publications include “International regimes as an analytical tool” (2016), “Comprehensive Approach in Crisis management: A literature review” (2017), “The British Referendum and European Security and Defence” (2017).

JAIME NOGUEIRA PINTO



Member of the Board and shareholder of Business Intelligence, Strategic Counseling and Private Security Companies. He got a Graduation in Law and a PhD in Social Sciences from the University of Lisbon. He is a Conferencist at the Institute of National Defense and at the Military Higher Institute in Portugal and at the Higher Institute of Military Education in Angola. He is Chairman of the Board of the Luso-African Cultural Foundation. He is member of the Heritage Foundation and the IEP (Bendern, Liechtenstein). He was an Invited Professor at ISCSP and at the Catholic and the Lusíada Universities. He was Member of the Board of the editing company Bertrand, S.A. and Director of the newspaper *O Século*. He published on contemporary history of Portugal (*O Fim do Estado Novo e as Origens do 25 de Abril, Introdução à Política, A Direita e as Direitas, Ideologia e Razão de Estado: uma História do Poder, Portugal Ascensão e Queda, O Islão e o Ocidente, Cinco Homens que Abalaram a Europa*). He is a regular collaborator of several media - newspapers, radios and televisions.

JOSÉ MANUEL FÉLIX RIBEIRO



Advisor to the Board of the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation and Invited Fellow of IPRI-UNL. He is also Vice-President of the Supervisory Board of the Lisbon Club. He worked in several government units of studies, prospective and planning from 1973 to 2012, including the Group of Basic Studies of Industrial Economics, the Service of Studies and Planning of the National Unit of Scientific and Technological Research and the Department of Prospective and Planning where he was Deputy-General Director from 1995 to 2006, being responsible for International Information and Prospective issues. He has conducted several studies and published several articles on international economics, prospective studies and development strategies. He got a BA in Economics at ISCEF in 1971 and a PhD in International Relations at the School of Social Sciences and Humanities of the Lisbon Nova University in 2012.

LUIS AMADO



Chairman of the General Supervision Board of EDP since 2018, he is also Invited Titular Professor at the Institute for social and Political Sciences (ISCSP-UL) and Chairman of the Board of the Lisbon Club. Since the 1990s he held several positions in the Portuguese Government, including Secretary of State Adjunct for Home Affairs, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and Cooperation (1995-1997 and 1999-2002), Minister of Defence (2005-2006) and Minister of State and Foreign Affairs (2006-2011). As part of his political activity, he was representative at the Regional Assembly of Madeira and member of the Portuguese Parliament. He graduated in Economics at the Technical University of Lisbon. Luis Amado was international consultant, adviser to the National Defence Institute and Visiting Professor at Georgetown University. He was non-executive Chairman of BANIF.

LUIS NUNO RODRIGUES



Associate Professor at the Department of History of ISCTE-IUL, where he coordinates the graduate program on History, Defense and International Relations and he is also the current Director of CEI-IUL, the Center for International Studies. He is also the Editor of the Portuguese Journal of Social Science. In 2006 and 2008, he was visiting professor at Brown University, USA. A former Fulbright student, Rodrigues holds a PhD in American History from the University of Wisconsin, Madison, USA, and a Master's degree on Portuguese 20th Century History, at Universidade Nova, Lisbon. Rodrigues has published several articles and books in Portugal and abroad. The Portuguese version of his PhD Dissertation, on Portuguese-American

relations during the Kennedy Administration was published in 2002 and won two national prizes in Portugal. His most recent book is a collective volume on worldwide perceptions of NATO, six decades after its creation.

MARINA COSTA LOBO



Principal Researcher with public habilitations at the Institute of Social Sciences of the University of Lisbon (ICS-UL), and Member of the Board of IPP – *Instituto de Políticas Públicas*. She is also Coordinator of the *Observatório da Qualidade da Democracia* at ICS-UL and Vice-President of the Board of the Lisbon Club. Her research interests focus on electoral behaviour and political institutions in Portugal in a comparative perspective. She was one of the co-directors of the Portuguese Election Study, which has carried out post-election surveys in Portugal since 2002. She published in

several academic journals. The most recent book is “Personality Politics? Leaders and Democratic Elections”, co-edited with John Curtice, Oxford University Press, 2015. In 2015, She won the European Research Council Consolidator Grant. She obtained her Doctorate in Politics in 2001 in Oxford University, St. Antony's College.

NUNO ANTUNES



Partner of Miranda & Associados, he is a specialist in law of the sea, working mainly on oil and gas issues. Previously (2006), he was Legal Adviser to the Prime Minister of Timor-Leste for the petroleum sector. He was Legal Coordinator of the Portuguese Task Group for the Extension of the Continental Shelf, expert to the Portuguese Strategic Commission on the Oceans, and currently integrates the arbitrators' list of the UN Convention on Law of the Sea. He taught Public International Law and Constitutional Law and is a regular speaker in PG courses and conferences. Nuno holds a BA in Naval Military Sciences (Portuguese Naval Academy) and in Law (University of Lisbon), a MA and a PhD from the University of Durham. He authored several books and articles,

including “Towards the Conceptualisation of Maritime Delimitation: Legal and Technical Aspects of a Political Process”, Brill, 2003.
